

## **Manifesto 2025-2026**

**The Human Security Committee is a student-led programme committee responsible for academic events, social events and programme outreach. The committee meets monthly with the programme coordinator to discuss events and future developments.**

### **Academic Committee / Social Committee**

The academic committee would like to focus on cross-disciplinary collaboration and partnerships with local, national and international agents to increase the program's impact and create a professional network while also including diverse perspectives. The goal is to expand the academic and practical scope of the program beyond the standard curriculum, offering students the most comprehensive learning opportunities, accessing applied theory, and witnessing firsthand experiences within the purview of human security.

Some of the activities may include but won't be limited to: Discussions and debates, workshops, film screenings, guest lectures, peer lectures, career events and networking events, panel debates (e.g. inviting previous Human Security students, students who operate within the field, etc.).

After agreement, the social committee merged into the academic committee, meaning that any activities with social scope will also be done under the academic umbrella, and those may include movie nights, bonfires, winter bathing, and sport activities, helping foster intercultural connection and inclusive social environment.

### **Outreach Committee**

The outreach committee aims to inform relevant stakeholders of the Human Security master's program, including, but not limited to, future students and field specific organisations and institutions.

We would like to offer practical information through interviews with and blog posts by current and former students. Through thematic blog posts by students (e.g. excerpts of their research),

we want to further increase the visibility of students' expertise and heighten the academic value of the Human Security program website for outsiders.

Utilizing social media such as Instagram, linked in program's homepage, and Facebook we aim to spread the word about human security. We are willing to collaborate with the official social media account of AU or other programs to address the inner workings of our master's program.

We aim to connect with possible future employers, bringing them into our courses and creating learning opportunities for students and employers to learn about each other.

### **UN Committee**

The UN delegates from the UN Council (Uddannelsesnævnet) aim to channel information between the students in the Human Security programme and the UN. The members will represent the Human Security programme at monthly meetings with other representatives from the University. Students from the Human Security program with relevant feedback or concerns can inform any UN members, who will forward these to the rest of the Council at the meetings. The goal is to ensure the academic basis for the programme and the overall educational environment, both at Moesgaard Campus and at Aarhus University in general. The members will share a document to all Human Security students at the end of every semester with all the relevant information from the Council meetings.
